Established in 1998, CFAAC is one of the largest funders of nonprofit organizations in Anne Arundel County. CFAAC distributes \$5 to \$7 million annually to a variety of nonprofit organizations.

Create Your Own Fund

With a single gift to CFAAC you can establish a Donor Advised Fund that allows you to give to the causes you care about most. Every gift qualifies for an immediate tax deduction, allowing you to make contributions and grants at your convenience.

Join a Giving Circle

Members pool their money to make grants that support local nonprofits and engage and educate donors around the issues impacting our community.

Support a Grant Program

- **Fund for Anne Arundel:** Fifty percent of the fund will be used for strategic grantmaking and fifty percent will be a permanently endowed discretionary fund that will be invested year after year to support local nonprofits that are addressing the community's most critical needs.
- **Grants 4 Teachers:** Provides grants to Anne Arundel County Public School teachers to fund creative ideas that stimulate and inspire student learning.
- Help Our Neighbors: Provides support to local agencies that respond to urgent assistance for basic human needs for families (e.g. emergency expenses, rent, utilities, licenses and certifications, transportation to work, essential medication, medical care).
- **Strengthening Nonprofits:** Provides funding for CFAAC's educational programs offered to local nonprofit organization's professionals, volunteers, and board members to receive training in fundraising and development, nonprofit management, board development, and marketing and communications.
- **Community Crisis Response Fund:** Provides flexible financial assistance for needs immediately following a violent incident, natural disaster or other crisis in our community. Funding will go to Anne Arundel County nonprofits to support the needs of Anne Arundel County residents.
- Women and Girls Fund: This Field of Interest Fund provides funding for local nonprofits that help
 women and girls pursue positive, productive lives by helping remove barriers for women and girls,
 increase their economic security, enhance their well-being and safety, and empower them to make
 positive life decisions for themselves and their families.
- **Environment Anne Arundel:** This Field of Interest Fund support projects that improve and green communities, address environmental issues such as stormwater, and/or increase student awareness and involvement in the restoration and protection of the Chesapeake Bay, local streams and rivers, and other natural areas.
- Arts & Culture Fund: This Field of Interest Fund provides access and opportunities for low wealth individuals and families to experience and/or participate in performing, visual, fine, decorative and folk arts as well as literature and language.
